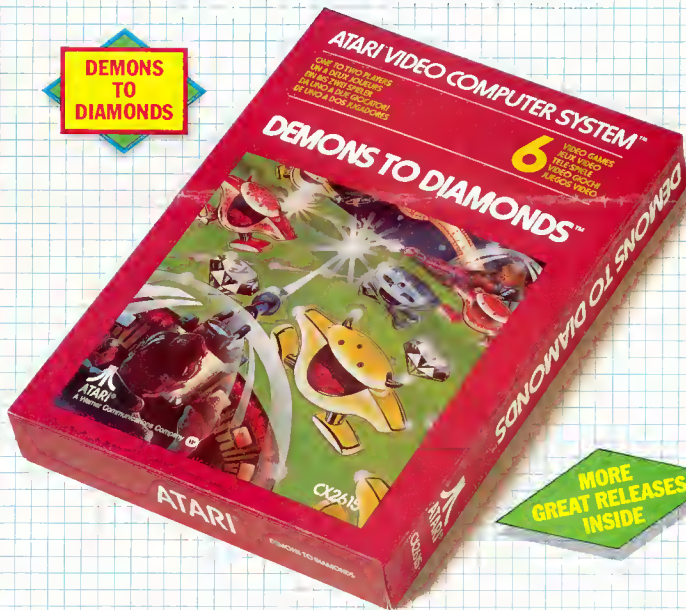

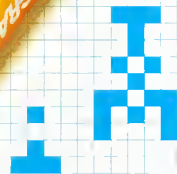

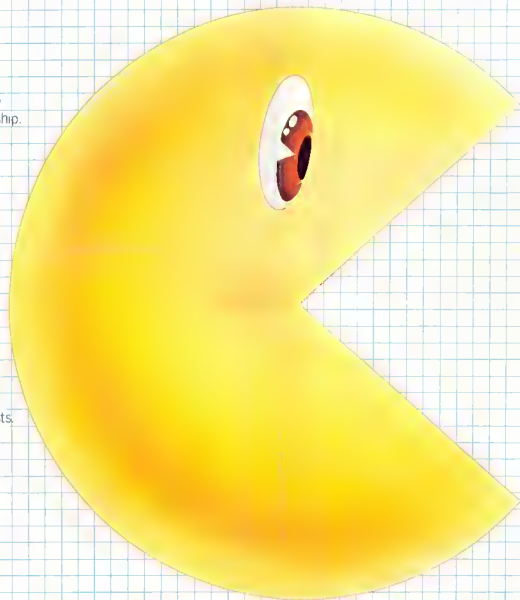

THE UK PAC-MAN CHAMPIONSHIP REGIONAL FINALS



July and August were very busy and exciting months for Captain Atari and his team travelling round the UK for the regional finals of the UK Pac-Man Championship. It was great to see so many Atarians and Pac-Man freaks – thanks for your support.

The Regional Championship was divided into four areas – North, South, Midlands and Scotland – with two finalists from each area in the over and under 25 age categories going through to the National Finals at the Barbican. Everyone competing in the regionals received a Pac-Man T-shirt and the top 32 scorers won the fascinating new Yari's Revenge cartridge. Pac-Man and Speedy,

the ghost, arrived at each venue to hand out Pac-Pens and Pac-Man Fever records and generally add to the fun.

First stop was the Albany Hotel in Birmingham on 25 July for the Midlands final where over 250 keen Pac-Man players gobbled ghosts all day long. Top scorers in the under-25 age group were Tony Monaghan (16) from Handsworth with 11,796 and Tony Eaton (17) from Penkridge with 10,969. Qualifying for the over-25 category were Trevor Yardley from Nuneaton and Tony Gray from Redditch.

A week later on 1 August it was the turn of the North of England to show their joystick skills at the

Hotel Majestic in Harrogate. David Boyes (17) from York and Craig Heap (16) from Radcliffe qualified for the National Finals with staggering scores of 13,452 and 13,226 a piece. Top scorers in the over-25 category were Patricia Buckley from Doncaster and Bill Halsall from Wigan.

Bonny Scotland was next with the Scottish Regional Finals being held at the Central Hotel in Glasgow on 8 August. Our youngest finalists qualified here – Stuart Murray from Potterton with 11,849 and John Taylor from Paisley with 10,848 – both aged 13. Unfortunately John was on holiday for the National Finals, so Gary Fleming, also 13, from Bathgate with 10,792 went in his place.

Sydney Trager and Ashley Broadbent were our over-25 finalists.

The last regional final was in London on 15 August for contestants from the South. Over 350 finalists competed at the Royal Garden Hotel, Kensington. Andrew Brzezinski (18) from Greenford was the top scorer with 10,616, closely followed by Cophia Yau (14) from Cambridge with 10,490. The over-25 contest was won by Clive Wilson from Guildford and Hazel Williams from Sunbridge in Kent.

Next stop... Barbican Centre!!! And then Monte Carlo for the two top scorers.
